

Staffing

- There is nothing to highlight for the proportion of education support staff relative to teaching staff.
- Per pupil spending was in the highest 20% of similar schools in 2021/22 for: Agency supply teaching staff, Education support staff, Teaching staff.
- Per pupil spending was in the lowest 20% of similar schools in 2021/22 for: Staff development and training.
- There is nothing to highlight for teachers with at least one period of sickness absence in 2021/22 or 2020/21.
- 10 days on average were lost to teacher sickness absence in 2021/22. This was in the highest 20% nationally.
- At the time of the November 2022 census, there were no full-time vacant teacher posts in the school.
- There is nothing to highlight for staff turnover in 2021, 2020 or 2019.

Links to alternative provision and other providers

There were no links identified for this school from the January 2023 census.

Absence

- There is nothing to highlight for overall absence in 2021/22 compared to all schools. The rate of overall absence (5.2%) in 2021/22 was in the **lowest** 20% of schools with a similar level of deprivation.
- There is nothing to highlight for persistent absence in 2021/22 compared to all schools. The rate of persistent absence (14.5%) in 2021/22 was in the **lowest** 20% of schools with a similar level of deprivation.

Suspensions & permanent exclusions

- For the whole school, there is nothing significant or exceptional to highlight for total suspensions compared to all schools in 2021/22, therefore no conclusions can be drawn from this data.
