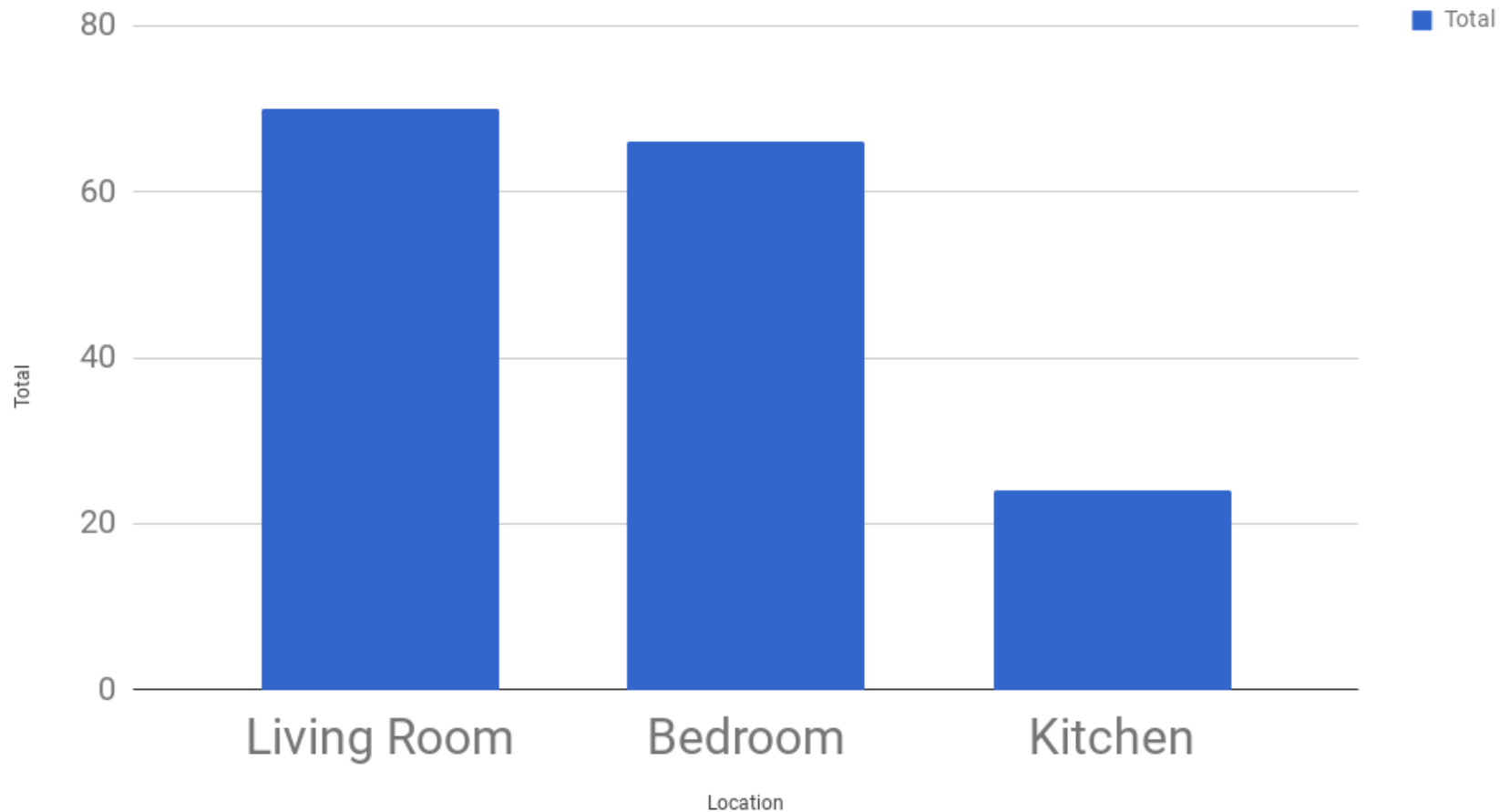

- *grossly offensive*
- *indecent, obscene or menacing*
- *For the purpose of causing annoyance, inconvenience or needless anxiety*
